**Greenwood United Church Annual Meeting
February 21, 2016**

Mary Hinan-Grose welcomed us to the Greenwood United Church Annual Meeting, and called for a motion to elect a chair and recording secretary. Ruth Benson made the motion that Mary Hinan-Grose be chairperson and Paulette Nichols, recording secretary for this meeting. This motion was seconded by Shirley Lannen and carried.

The Agenda for the meeting was distributed. Brian Nichols moved acceptance of the Agenda as printed, seconded by Roger Clapperton and carried. Paulette Nichols moved the acceptance of the minutes of Feb. 22nd, 2015 as amended with a correction to the number of attendees at the Shining Water Festival, seconded by Dawn Cox, and carried. Paulette Nichols also moved acceptance of the minutes of the June 28th, 2015 Congregational Meeting, seconded by Ruth Benson and carried.

Business Arising:

1. Ruth Benson thanked people for the contributions made to choose a new name for the congregation.
2. The JNAC was completed and approved by the congregation at the June 28th congregational meeting.
3. The Interview Team (formerly identified as the Search Committee) was elected at the June 28th congregational meeting and is now working towards calling a new minister for Greenwood.

The reports as printed on pages 8 through 16 were presented. Discussion of the reports followed. Under the Ministry and Personnel Report, Susie Bunting reported that she took the web site course, and then donated the cost of the course back to the church. She also mentioned that the web site is being visited regularly. Ruth Benson commented that more money was raised from the election than what was reported under the Stewards' Report. Thanks were extended to the people who worked at Greenwood for the election, particularly noting the leadership provided by Gary Madden. Mary Hinan-Grose spoke to the UCW Report, noting that there are fewer fundraisers now as the numbers attending the meetings are decreasing. We were also reminded to save soup labels, corks and stamps for the UCW Presbyterial. Commenting on the Choir Report, Shirley Lannen shared that it would be grand to have more choir members; thanks were expressed to the faithful dedication of those who help to provide musical leadership every week. The Green Team Report was presented by Susie Bunting, and led to energetic discussion about the work of this committee. There is a possibility that Greenwood will host a beehive for Peterborough Greenup. There would need to be some alterations to the property (a 10' x 10' fenced enclosure) and the Trustees would sign off on any of these property changes. Ruth Benson suggested that we might take this plan to the congregation for final approval before a commitment is confirmed with Peterborough Greenup. "Green creates discussion". Dawn Cox and Rev. Allan Reeve highlighted some of the changes which are happening in Presbytery. Mary Hinan-Grose amended the Trustees' Report, noting that the Market Value as of December 15, 2015 should read \$581,846. The reports were then moved for acceptance by Susie Bunting, seconded by Gladys McNabb, and carried.

Financial Reports: Ruth Benson addressed the Greenwood United Church Financial Summary 2015. She also highlighted the Zimbabwe, Memorial, Capital Property and Music Fund Accounts. The balance under the Music Account was amended to \$1339.22. Ruth then spoke to the Greenwood Proposed Budget for 2016, noting that the Net Income loss in 2015 was less than it has been for the past two years. Emil Varga noted that after considerable consultation, the United Church of Canada has finally acknowledged the new congregation, “Greenwood United Church”. Ruth continues to work with the Canadian government regarding the name change. The Presbytery levy has been reduced to more accurately reflect the number of church members. Ruth reported that NJ Gould Accounting would be reviewing the financial reports. A motion was made by Ken Minion to empower Ruth Benson to hire NJ Gould Accounting to review the financial reports for the last two years. The motion was seconded by Shirley Lannen and carried. Emil moved acceptance of the Greenwood Financial Summary, and the Proposed Budget. This motion was seconded by Aileen Castle and carried.

Nomination Report: Brian Nichols presented the Nomination Report. There are openings for new members of the Session Committee and the Nominating Committee, and Brian invited volunteers to fill some of these positions. Kelly Henwood agreed to go on Session for a three-year appointment. Peggy Gilbert agreed to make a three-year commitment to the Nominating Committee. Because Paulette Nichols is on the Interview Team in the search for a new minister at Greenwood, she will step away from the Ministry and Personnel Committee(M & P Committee) until the search process is completed. Joyce Fee agreed to remain on the Ministry and Personnel Committee until Paulette has completed her involvement with the Interview Team, at which time Paulette will go back on the M & P Committee, and Joyce will be finished. Brian moved acceptance of the amended report, adding Kelly Henwood’s name for a 3-year term under “Session”, and Peggy Gilbert for a 3-year term under “Nominating Committee”. This amended report was seconded by Kelly Henwood, and carried.

New Business: There were no items of new business at this time.

Rev. Allan Reeve thanked the Greenwood community for the time he has spent with the congregation, getting to know people, and who we are as a faith community. On behalf of the United Church of Canada, Allan offered thanks to the people of Greenwood for existing as a vital, healthy congregation. Mary then asked Allan to end this meeting with prayer. Emil Varga made a motion to adjourn the meeting .

**Greenwood United Church Congregational Meeting
June 5, 2016**

Jan Hay called the meeting to order as Presbytery representative on the Interview Team for the Greenwood Pastoral Charge. This meeting was called to hear the recommendation from the interview team. Jan explained the process which would be followed, and that only full members of this pastoral charge would be eligible to vote. She then turned the meeting over to Emil Varga as Chair of the Interview Team.

Emil introduced the members of this team: Ken Minion, Carol Hopkinson, Anne Wilson, Paulette Nichols and himself, Emil Varga. The report to the congregation from the interview team was available prior to the worship service, and will be attached to these Minutes. Emil read parts of this report, highlighting the criteria the team was to look for in our new minister as set out in the JNAC report, and the skills which the applicant brings which compliment these priorities. He then presented the name of the person to be called – Rev. Allan Reeve.

Following this announcement, Emil outlined the terms which were negotiated with Allan Reeve. The base salary will be \$31,210 plus named benefits. The terms are for 33 Sundays per annum. Allan will have one Sunday off per month, plus vacation, study leave, and one Sunday off for Conference. This means there will be 19 Sundays when worship will be covered by alternate leadership. The Ministry and Personnel Committee (M & P Committee) will review the terms in November, 2016.

Discussion of the terms followed. Barb Johnston opened the discussion by stating that this agreement for “33 Sundays per annum” is different from the agreement currently in place with Rev. Reeve. Joyce Fee re-iterated this comment. Further questions followed about the commitment to “33 Sundays per annum”. The worship teams will be able to help cover some (6) services per year, and supply ministers will be employed for some services. Jan Hay explained that the negotiations for 50% ministry are new and different for this congregation. This reduced ministry is different from what we have been operating with. The “33 Sundays per annum” is a terminology being used in Peterborough Presbytery for part-time ministry. Part-time ministers could agree to be in the pulpit for 26 Sundays per annum, but 33 Sundays is better for congregations and provides more continuity of ministry. Jan also emphasized that the M & P Committee can meet to discuss future negotiations but today’s agreement must be what is on the table for consideration. We cannot modify the agreement at this time.

Gary Madden expressed support for the applicant presented in this report. Ruth Benson reminded the congregation that Greenwood would be closed for the first 2 weeks in August, and will be worshipping with others at Lang on the 3rd Sunday in August. These Sundays will not need to be covered by alternate leadership. Dawn Cox thanked the interview team for their work on this call. Gary Benson asked how many applications were received. Jan Hay responded that more than one application was received; the recommended candidate was not the only one considered.

Jan then called for a motion from the interview team, and the following motion was made.

“That the congregation of Greenwood Pastoral Charge accept the recommendation of the Interview Team.”

This motion was made by Emil Varga and seconded by Paulette Nichols.

Jan then announced that the vote would be done by a show of hands or if preferred, by ballot. It was agreed that the vote would be by a show of hands.

In favour of the motion: 25

Those opposing: 5

Abstentions: 0

The motion was carried.

Jan then closed this meeting with prayer.

From the Minister's desk...

The last twelve months have challenged me in many ways. Getting to know a group of people both as individuals with unique life stories – and as a group with a history; a certain way of doing things, and its own personality or culture – has kept me wondering, watching, and asking.

Lynn and I bought a little apple tree last summer than has four different branches grafted onto the main trunk each offering different varieties of apples.

Greenwood is a tree planted in good soil. New branches have been grafted onto this tree over the years. And now, like the proverbial mustard tree - all kinds of creatures are finding a home in its branches. AND we have the BEES to pollinate our blossoms for the fruit to come!

Another story. “God’s kingdom is like a pine nut that a farmer plants. It is quite small as seeds go, but in the course of years it grows into a huge pine tree, and eagles build nests in it.”

A big challenge for the congregation – and their Minister - is to grapple with what it means to be in a “shared ministry” with a part-time ordained clergy.

In my last two churches I found serving a congregation full time was challenging. There just aren’t enough hours in a week to meet all the needs. This solo-ministry model has burned out many well-intentioned servants of Christ.

The Covenanting service that inducted me as your Minister was unusual in that it included a fourth partner in the covenant. In addition to acknowledging the shared work of Presbytery, the congregation, and the clergy, we acknowledged the shared relationship with Bedford House as a community ministry.

We’re exploring what it means for lay members to step up and serve alongside an ordained “coach”. Our two worship teams have been well received. Members of the team report a deepening of their own faith journeys from the experience. A third team has just emerged.

It’s also been wonderful to see how – as Shirley has had to step back due to injury – other talents in choir and congregation have stepped forward. This is evidence of the Spirit’s fruit among us.

My questions going into 2017 include:

How might the gifts and passions of each member find a branch to blossom on?

How might we share the resilience of faith with those suffering the storms of life?

How might the Spirit inspire new teams to fly with God’s wind beneath their wings?

- ≡ Roll clerk – Mary Grose-Hinan works behind the scenes assisting in the role of the Roll clerk as well as giving us her very knowledgeable advice
- ≡ Pastoral Care – Gloria Madden helps us by sending greeting cards to shut-ins or members who may benefit from a cheerful note. Original hand-made Christmas cards created by Emil Varga & signed by church members – were either hand delivered or sent to our shut-ins

During the summer we made repairs to the sound system and purchased a new wireless head set. Projects which will be taking place in the near future will be repainting of the lower hall and lifting up the tile floor and replacing it with a good quality carpet tile.

I would like to thank all those who give of their time and ideas to make this place run.

Shining Waters Presbytery Report for 2016

The function of Presbytery is to provide oversight and pastoral care for all of the United Churches within the new boundaries of Shining Waters Presbytery. It appears that we desperately need more people interested and involved with the administration and work of the wider church. All members and adherents of Greenwood are welcome to attend any Presbytery meeting. Meetings are held the first Wednesday of every second month at different churches from September through June with the Executive meetings on alternate months. The Presbytery office is located in the former St. Andrew's U.C. and is open Wednesday mornings except when there is a Wednesday Presbytery or Executive meeting.

On January 23/16 a number of us attended a meeting in Lakefield U. C. about the future of our churches. It was led by Conference personnel. We had an exchange of information and ideas regarding the proposed change from a four-court to three-court system. In the autumn, four of us attended a meeting in Keene about the General Council remits, that we will all need to vote on.

Some places where we are seen or our presence in local life is felt include: community dinners (working with One Roof Diner), Trent Chaplaincy, members who support Habitat for Humanity, a Presbytery presence in the Pride Parade, advocacy for our First Nations, and at the 2016 Reframe Festival. MORRE division of Presbytery sponsored the film "After the Last River". Our MORRE chair, Lyn Millar organized making valentines, then she went to Ottawa to deliver them to the Prime Minister for the "Have a Heart project", in support of improving education for First Nations children. As well, Presbytery voted to support Bedford House for three years, contributing \$15, 000 in 2016 to that valuable community outreach in our downtown.

In January the Rev. Warren Vollmer, Lakefield was the chair. For a number of years Wendy Djuric was our very capable secretary but we were all sad that she passed away in June. Thankfully the Rev. Wendy Bullock has filled the post of acting secretary until the beginning of 2017; she is still a valuable support for our new secretary, Karen Carter. Larry Breckenridge was installed as new Chair of Presbytery at Grace U.C. in June. He and Rev. Jim Feairs took the service in October for our Pastoral Oversight Sunday. In September when we met in Bancroft, Nasrin Naseri, the wife & mother of our sponsored Syrian family (Ahmad, Nasrin, Nader (15) & Nadia(7 or 8) joined us and said a heart felt thank-you for all the support they've had. Ahmad now has full time work and Nader has been elected to attend Youth Parliament from his school (Thomas A. Stewart S.S.)

May 27-29/16 the annual Bay of Quinte Conference was held in Pembroke (in Upper Valley Presbytery) with the theme "Do We Dare". It was very, very hot in their church sanctuary, but the music was wonderful, as always. There are lay and clergy representatives from the eight Presbyteries. We share information and fellowship, say thanks to those retiring and welcome those being ordained.

The Rev. Don Stiles was installed as President for the conference year of 2016-2017. Mary Gordon, now a member of our congregation is a member-at-large of Shining Waters Presbytery and a valued member of the MOORE committee.
